Army Troops Companies and Canadian Engineers

Introduction

Army Troops Companies and Canadian Engineers worked in the corps area on the construction of defences, accommodation and route communications. In addition, they ran corps workshops and parks, built positions for heavy guns and worked on water supply, frequently in forward areas.

Arrived in England 1 November 1915.

Redesignated as 1st Army Corps Troops Company, Canadian Engineers in November 1915.

Arrived in France 17 January 1916.

1st Canadian Division.

Redesignated as 1st Army Troops Company, Canadian Engineers in February 1916.

Demobilized at Ottawa, April 1919.

Disbanded by General Order 192 of 1 November 1920.

Demobilized at London, Ontario April 1919

Disbanded by General Order 192 of 1 November 1920.

Arrived in France 28 June 1917. Under the command of CRE Corps Troops, Canadian Corps until November 1917 when it came under the command of CRE VIII and, later, XIII Corps of the British Army. It was returned to the Canadian Corps in March 1918.

Demobilized at Winnipeg in April 1919.

Disbanded by General Order 192 of 1 November 1920.
